



With a biblical Greeting, the minister declares God's welcome.



A reading from Ezekiel

¹The hand of the LORD came upon me, and he brought me out by the spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones. ²He led me all around them; there were very many lying in the valley, and they were very dry. ³He said to me, "Mortal, can these bones live?" I answered, "O Lord God, you know." ⁴Then he said to me, "Prophesy to these bones, and say to them: O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. ⁶I will lay sinews on you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live; and you shall know that I am the LORD." Second Reading — *Acts 2:1-21*

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

¹When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Praise the Lord! How good it is to sing praises to our God; for he is gracious, and a song of praise is fitting. ² The Lord builds up Jerusalem; he gathers the outcasts of Israel. ³ He heals the brokenhearted, and binds up their wounds. Psalm 147:1-3⁵Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, ¹¹Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." ¹²All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." ¹⁴But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. ¹⁵Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. ¹⁶No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: ¹⁷'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. ¹⁸Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. ¹⁹And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. ²⁰The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. ²¹Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."






Preface

It is indeed right and salutary that we should at all times and in all places offer thanks and praise to you, O Lord, holy Father, through Christ our Lord; who rose beyond the bounds of death and, on this day, as he had promised, poured out your Spirit of life and power upon the chosen disciples. At this the whole earth exults in boundless joy. And so, with the Church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Sanctus

We join with the heavenly hosts in bowing before the throne of Almighty God to sing this hymn of praise. (Isaiah 6:3; Revelation 4:8)



Eucharistic Prayer

The pastor continues the great thanksgiving by recalling the saving work of the Triune God. This version includes the words of thanksgiving from the Jewish Seder that would have been said when Jesus "gave thanks".

We give you thanks, Father, through Jesus Christ, your beloved Son, whom you sent in this end of the ages to save and redeem us and to proclaim to us your will. He fulfilled the promises made to our forebears by his obedience to your will and became for us the sacrificial Lamb by which we are redeemed.

This same Lord Jesus Christ, in the night he was handed over to suffering and death, taking the bread, gave thanks, saying: Blessed are you, O Lord our God, King of the universe, who brings forth bread from the earth. Blessed are You, O Lord, our God, King of the universe, who has chosen us from among all people, and raised us above all tongues, and made us holy through His commandments. This is the bread of affliction that our ancestors ate in the land of Egypt. Whoever is hungry, let them come and eat; whoever is in need, let them come. And he gave it to them, saying: This is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me. And taking the cup, he gave thanks, saying:

Blessed are you, O Lord our God, King of the universe, who brings forth fruit of the vine. Blessed are You, O Lord our God, King of the universe, who has redeemed us and redeemed our ancestors from slavery. So, we shall eat the Passover lamb whose blood shall be sprinkled on the wall of Your altar. And we shall thank You with a new song for our redemption and for the deliverance of our souls. Blessed are You, God, who redeemed Israel.

And he gave it to them saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, poured out for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sins. Do this for the remembrance of me. The mystery of faith:

Send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may become for us the Body and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ. C: I will bless the Lord at all times; His praise is always in my mouth. My mouth will utter the praise of the Lord, and all flesh shall bless His holy Name forever and ever. And we will bless the Lord from now and forever; Hallelujah, praise the Lord. Amen.

The Lord's Prayer

Let us pray for God to breathe his Spirit into our mortal bodies and give us life, as our Lord has taught us:

C: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come,

thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us;

and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.


For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.


