



The Liturgy of the Word

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

First Reading — *Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31*

A reading from Proverbs

¹Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice? ²On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; ³beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: ⁴"To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live. ²²The LORD created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago. ²³Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. ²⁴When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. ²⁵Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth— ²⁶when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil. ²⁷When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, ²⁸when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, ²⁹when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, ³⁰then I was beside him, like a master worker; and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, ³¹rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race."

A reading from Romans



of one Being with the Father.**

he suffered death and was buried.**

Further the work of international collaboration and peacemaking, especially in Ukraine, Yemen, Sudan, and Ethiopia. God of grace, **C: hear our prayer.**

P: Abiding Comforter, you call out to all who live. Restore severed relationships and protect children who lack trustworthy caregivers. Grant hope to those who are experiencing fear, pain, or grief, especially those we name before you.....Console grieving families. God of grace, **C: hear our prayer.**

P: Holy Three in One, you are community and you create community. Build up ministries that support those who are isolated or lonely. Give endurance as we nurture vital relationships in our congregation and beyond. God of grace, **C: hear our prayer.**

P: Holy God, we remember your saints for their strong faith and witness, even unto death– especially the Emanuel Nine martyrs, whom we commemorate this week. Stir up in us the resolve to end the sin of white supremacy and pursue the courageous path of justice, as we seek your mercy on the Day of Christ's coming. God of grace, **C: hear our prayer.**

P: Into your hands, O Lord, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy, for the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. **C: Amen.**

Peace

Because of Jesus' death and resurrection. God does not hold our sins against us. This is true peace, Like Jesus with his disciples, the pastor shares the word of reconciliation from God to us.

P: The peace of the Lord be with you always. **C: And also with you.**
