Prelude

Thanksgiving for Baptism

You are invited to have a bowl of water and a lighted candle nearby. All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly.

P: Joined to Christ in the waters of baptism, we are clothed with God's mercy and forgiveness. Let us give thanks for the gift of baptism.

Water may be poured into the font as the presiding minister gives thanks.

P: We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight.

P: Through the waters of the flood you condemned the wicked and delivered Noah and his family. Through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By water and your Word you claim us as daughters and sons, making us heirs of your promise and servants of all.

P: We praise you for the gift of water that sustains life, and above all we praise you for the gift of new life in Jesus Christ. Shower us with your Spirit, and renew our lives with your forgiveness, grace, and love.

P: To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. **C: Amen.**

You are invited to dip your fingers into your bowl of water and make the sign of the cross on yourself or on each other.

A brief silence is kept before the prayer.

P: Father in heaven, at the baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan you proclaimed him your beloved Son and anointed him with the Holy Spirit. Make all who are baptized into Christ faithful in their calling to be your children and inheritors with him of everlasting life; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **C: Amen**

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

First Reading – Genesis 1:1-5

A reading from Genesis

¹In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, ²the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. ³Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. ⁴And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

P: The Word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

Second Reading – Acts 19:1-7

A reading from Acts

¹While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the interior regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. ²He said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?" They replied, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." ³Then he said, "Into what then were you baptized?" They answered, "Into John's baptism." ⁴Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus." ⁵On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ⁶When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied—⁷altogether there were about twelve of them.

P: The word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God.**

Gospel Acclamation (sung to the tune of Hark! The Herald Angels Sing)

Holy Gospel – Mark 1:4-11


P: The holy gospel according to St. Mark. C: Glory to you, O Lord

⁴John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. ⁸I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." ⁹In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. ¹¹And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

P: The gospel of the Lord. C: Praise to you, O Christ.

The Message

The assembly is seated. Silence for reflection follows the sermon.



Nicene Creed

Together with the whole church, let us confess our faith:

C: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,

- We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God,
- Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father.
- Through him all things were made.
- For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven; by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the virgin Mary, and was made man.
- For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.
- On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
- He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.
- We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.
- With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.
- He has spoken through the prophets.
- We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
- We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen

Prayers of Intercession

P: As we celebrate Jesus Christ the Son embodied in human flesh and blood, let us pray to the Father for the church, the world, and all of creation.

A brief silence.

P: Gracious and merciful God, inspire wisdom and a spirit of proclamation in your church. Uplift leaders to share the truth of your word in community, especially Elizabeth, James, and Geoffrey our bishops, and all pastors and deacons. Encourage all Christians to live into the promises of baptism. God of grace, **C: receive our prayer.**

P: Renew your creation and restore the rivers in which your children are baptized. Summon the stewards and caretakers of the land to cherish your good works. God of grace, **C: receive our prayer.**

P: Be present in every country and community. Raise up leaders committed to equity and healing for those most in need. Grant them discernment and compassion as they lead in love. God of grace, **C: receive our prayer.**

P: Protect and cherish the most vulnerable among us. Accompany those separated from family or hurting from broken relationships. Shelter our unhoused neighbors and any experiencing poverty. Protect those incarcerated in prisons and detention centers. Care for the sick and suffering, especially those we name now.... (*pause*).... God of grace,

C: receive our prayer.

P: Encourage our congregations, especially those facing challenges that make the future uncertain. Guide us in accompanying, learning from, and serving our neighbors, following the example of Jesus. God of grace, **C: receive our prayer.**

P: Help us to entrust all who have died into your care. Give hope to those who grieve even as we rest in your eternal promise of resurrection. God of grace, **C: receive our prayer.**

P: Trusting the Holy Spirit to intercede for us, we offer these prayers and the silent prayers of our hearts in the name of your Son, our Savior, Jesus Christ. **C: Amen.**

Peace

Because of Jesus' death and resurrection. God does not hold our sins against us. This is true peace, Like Jesus with his disciples, pastor shares the word of reconciliation from God to us.

P: The peace of the Lord be with you always. **C: And also with you.**

We share Christ's forgiving and reconciling love with one another, binding ourselves to one another as community. As we are at peace with God, so we are also at peace with one another.

Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us.


C: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
