

P: Lord Jesus, You come with signs of healing and new life. Lord, have mercy.


C: Forgive us when we do not see your presence in our lives. Lord, have mercy.



# A reading from Jonah

<sup>1</sup>The word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time, saying, <sup>2</sup>"Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you."

<sup>3</sup>So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. <sup>4</sup>Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, "Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" <sup>5</sup>And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth. <sup>10</sup>When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

# Second Reading — 1 Corinthians 7:29-31


A reading from 1 Corinthians

# **Gospel** — *Mark* 1:14-20

P: The holy gospel according to St. Mark. C: Glory to you, O Lord

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>14</sup>Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, <sup>15</sup>and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news." <sup>16</sup>As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. <sup>17</sup>And Jesus said to them, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." <sup>18</sup>And immediately they left their nets and followed him. <sup>19</sup>As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. <sup>20</sup>Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.

Empower us and our congregations to be open to your call. When we are uncertain of your guidance, assure us. When we have strayed from your ways, redirect us. God of grace, **C**: receive our prayer.

P: Accept our thanks for all the saints as we entrust our beloved dead into your care. Comfort those who grieve, and help us to place our hope in your salvation. God of grace, **C: receive our prayer.** 

P: Trusting the Holy Spirit to intercede for us, we offer these prayers and the silent prayers of our hearts in the name of your Son, our Savior, Jesus Christ. **C: Amen.**

Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us.




