P: Lord Jesus, you plead for sinners at the throne of judgment. Lord, have mercy.


C: Forgive us when we try to defend ourselves instead of trusting you. Lord, have mercy.

The Liturgy of the Word

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

First Reading – Isaiah 45:1-7

A reading from Isaiah

¹Thus says the LORD to his anointed, to Cyrus, whose right hand I have grasped to subdue nations before him and strip kings of their robes, to open doors before him—and the gates shall not be closed: ²I will go before you and level the mountains, I will break in pieces the doors of bronze and cut through the bars of iron, ³I will give you the treasures of darkness and riches hidden in secret places, so that you may know that it is I, the LORD, the God of Israel, who call you by your name. ⁴For the sake of my servant Jacob, and Israel my chosen, I call you by your name, I surname you, though you do not know me. ⁶I am the LORD, and there is no other; besides me there is no god. I arm you, though you do not know me, ⁶so that they may know, from the rising of the sun and from the west, that there is no one besides me; I am the LORD, and there is no other. ⁷I form light and create darkness, I make weal and create woe; I the LORD do all these things.

P: The Word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

Psalm 96:1-10

Second Reading – 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10

A reading from 1 Thessalonians

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace. "We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly ^aremembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁴For we know, brothers and sisters beloved by God, that he has chosen you, ⁵because our message of the gospel came to you not in word only. but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of persons we proved to be among you for your sake. ⁶And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, 'so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. [®]For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but in every place your faith in God has become known, so that we have no need to speak about it. "For the people of those regions report about us what kind of welcome we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols, to serve a living and true God, ¹⁰ and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead-Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath that is coming.

P: The word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

Holy Gospel – Matthew 22:15-22


P: The holy gospel according to St. Matthew. C: Glory to you, O Lord

¹⁰Then the Pharisees went and plotted to entrap [Jesus] in what he said. ¹¹So they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are sincere, and teach the way of God in accordance with truth, and show deference to no one; for you do not regard people with partiality. ¹⁷Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?" ¹⁸But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, "Why are you putting me to the test, you hypocrites? ¹⁹Show me the coin used for the tax." And they brought him a denarius. ²⁰Then he said to them, "Whose head is this, and whose title?" ²¹They answered, "The emperor's." Then he said to them, "Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's." ²²When they heard this, they were amazed; and they left him and went away.

P: The gospel of the Lord. C: Praise to you, O Christ.

Apostles' Creed

God has made us his people through our Baptism into Christ. Living together in trust and hope, we confess our faith.

C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate,

was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended into hell.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Prayers of the Church

P: Remind us that all our life belongs to you. When earthly idols threaten to lead us astray, remind us that you alone are the source of our eternal hope. Direct the work of church treasurers, councils, and all who manage financial matters. Lord, in your mercy, **C: hear our prayer.**

P: Make us aware of how the sea roars, the earth rejoices, and the heavens are glad at the wonder of all you have made. Bless the work of ecologists and conservationists and all those who safeguard the riches of creation. Lord, in your mercy, **C: hear our prayer.**

P: Grant all people to acknowledge your rule and authority over the cosmos. As you once worked through the ruler Cyrus for the good of your people, accomplish your purposes through the work of elected leaders and public servants in our world. Guide them with your wisdom and compassion. Lord, in your mercy, **C: hear our prayer.**

P: Enfold in your loving arms all who are lonely, oppressed, despairing, sick, and suffering, especially those we name now... (*pause*). Pour out your abundant mercy on all whom this world has neglected, abandoned, and forgotten, so that they may know your joy. Lord, in your mercy, **C: hear our prayer.**

P: Accept our thanks for the witness of the saints of every age who have sung your praise and shared your word. Grant us grace to follow Christ, so that we may join them as citizens of your unending kingdom. Lord, in your mercy, **C: hear our prayer.**

P: Heavenly Father, remember us according to your steadfast love as we offer these and the prayers of our heart, trusting in your compassion made known through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. **C: Amen.**

Peace

Because of Jesus' death and resurrection. God does not hold our sins against us. This is true peace, Like Jesus with his disciples, pastor shares the word of reconciliation from God to us.
