#### **Confession & Forgiveness**

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

P: In the Name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **C: Amen** 

P: Lord Jesus, you look on us with compassion and seek us when we are lost. Lord, have mercy.

C: Forgive our straying from your path and help us to forgive others. Lord, have mercy.

P: Lord Jesus, you have mercy on all who need healing and comfort. Christ, have mercy.

C: Forgive us when we forget to turn to you in our troubles. Christ, have mercy.

P: Lord Jesus, you plead for sinners at the throne of judgment. Lord, have mercy.


C: Forgive us when we try to defend ourselves instead of trusting you. Lord, have mercy.

The presiding minister announces God's forgiveness with these or similar words.

P: In the mercy of almighty God, Jesus Christ was given to die for us, and for his sake God forgives us all our sins. As a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ, and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **C: Amen.**

#### First Reading – Amos 5:18-24

#### A reading from Amos

<sup>19</sup>Alas for you who desire the day of the LORD! Why do you want the day of the LORD? It is darkness, not light; <sup>19</sup>as if someone fled from a lion, and was met by a bear; or went into the house and rested a hand against the wall, and was bitten by a snake. <sup>20</sup>Is not the day of the LORD darkness, not light, and gloom with no brightness in it? <sup>21</sup>I hate, I despise your festivals, and I take no delight in your solemn assemblies. <sup>22</sup>Even though you offer me your burnt offerings and grain offerings, I will not accept them; and the offerings of well-being of your fatted animals I will not look upon. <sup>23</sup>Take away from me the noise of your songs; I will not listen to the melody of your harps. <sup>24</sup>But let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream.

P: The Word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

#### Psalm 70

'Be pleased, O God, to de-' liver me; O LORD, make ' haste to help me.

<sup>2</sup>Let those who seek my life be ashamed and altogeth-<sup>1</sup> er dismayed; let those who take pleasure in my misfortune draw back and be disgraced.

<sup>a</sup>Let those who say to me "Aha!" and gloat over ' me turn back, because they ' are ashamed.

# Second Reading – 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

#### A reading from 1 Thessalonians

<sup>13</sup>We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. <sup>14</sup>For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died. <sup>15</sup>For this we declare to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will by no means precede those who have died. <sup>16</sup>For the Lord himself, with a cry of command, with the archangel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet, will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. <sup>17</sup>Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught

up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air; and so we will be with the Lord forever. <sup>18</sup>Therefore encourage one another with these words.

P: The word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

The assembly stands to welcome the gospel.

The cantor will sing the alleluia once alone and then the congregation repeats it.

#### Holy Gospel – Matthew 25:1-13

P: The holy gospel according to St. Matthew C: Glory to you, O Lord

[Jesus said to the disciples:] ""Then the kingdom of heaven will be like this. Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. "Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. "When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them; "but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. "As the bridegroom was delayed, all of them became drowsy and slept. "But at midnight there was a shout, 'Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' "Then all those bridesmaids got up and trimmed their lamps. "The foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' "But the wise replied, 'No! there will not be enough for you and for us; you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves.' "And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went with him into the wedding banquet; and the door was shut. "Later the other bridesmaids came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' "But he replied, 'Truly I tell you, I do not know you.' "Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour."

P: The gospel of the Lord. C: Praise to you, O Christ.

#### Apostles' Creed

God has made us his people through our Baptism into Christ. Living together in trust and hope, we confess our faith.

C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate,

was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended into hell.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

#### Prayers of the Church

P: Remembering the caring and generous works of God, we pray to the Father for the church, creation, and the needs of our neighbors.

A brief silence.

P: Father in heaven, grant your Son Jesus to come quickly to your people, bringing the fullness of your salvation. By your Holy Spirit, center us in hope found only in you. Deepen our faith as we worship you and receive the means of grace, and send us out to live in your justice and truth. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.** 

P: Restore your creation, corrupted by humanity's sin. Save us from foolish, wasteful living. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.** 

P: Let your justice roll down like waters on all nations. Bless citizens with wise leaders; save your children from war. Support the veterans of this community, and provide for their needs. Hear us, O God.

#### C: Your mercy is great.

P: Provide for all in need and especially those who experience homelessness or hunger. Support the under- or unemployed, and comfort any who are grieving or suffering this day, especially those we name now..... (*pause*)..... Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.** 

P: Fill our worship with hymns to proclaim your greatness. Help us to sing and dance with joy and tell boldly of your salvation. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.** 

P: Accept our thanks for our loved ones who have died and now live in you. Bring comfort and the assurance of new life to all who grieve, and grant us all to long for the day when Christ will come to bring the new heaven and the new earth. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.** 

P: Heavenly Father, remember us according to your steadfast love as we offer these and the prayers of our heart, trusting in your compassion made known through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. **C: Amen.** 

#### Peace

Because of Jesus' death and resurrection. God does not hold our sins against us. This is true peace, Like Jesus with his disciples, pastor shares the word of reconciliation from God to us.

P: The peace of the Lord be with you always. **C: And also with you.** 

We share Christ's forgiving and reconciling love with one another, binding ourselves to one another as community. As we are at peace with God, so we are also at peace with one another.
