

Let us open our ears and hearts to hear God's voice in the words spoken to us.


Let us celebrate new life by putting God's Word into action.

Second Reading — 1 Peter 2:19-25

A reading from 1 Peter

"It is a credit to you if, being aware of God, you endure pain while suffering unjustly. "If you endure when you are beaten for doing wrong, what credit is that? But if you endure when you do right and suffer for it, you have God's approval. "For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps. "He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth." "When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly. "He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. "For you were going astray like sheep, but now you have returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls."

Holy Gospel — John 10:1-10


P: The holy gospel according to St. John. **C: Glory to you, O Lord.**

[Jesus said:] "Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheep-fold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. "The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. "The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. "When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. "They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." "Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. "So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. "All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. "I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.

Nicene Creed

Together with the whole Church, we confess our faith:

C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father.

Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven;

by the power of the Holy Spirit

he became incarnate from the virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.

- P: Direct leaders in our own time to learn from Jesus' example of shepherding love and his instruction in the way, the truth, and the life. Give them servant hearts, that they may generously seek the good of all. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.**
- P: Journey with us wherever our paths may lead. Give peace and assurance to those feeling overwhelmed by anxiety or depression or suffering in any way, especially those we name now...... Hear us, O God. C: Your mercy is great.
- P: By your Word and sacraments, be the gate that gives safety to your beloved flocks. Provide protection for refugees, victims of domestic violence, those who are imprisoned, and all people who are vulnerable to violence and mistreatment. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.**
- P: Call your sheep by name and lead us through the valley of the shadow of death. Accept our thanks for those who have died and now dwell in your house forever. Comfort those who mourn, and give them hope in the promise of resurrection. Hear us, O God.

C: Your mercy is great.

P: Rejoicing in the victory of Christ's resurrection, we lift our prayers and praise to you, almighty and eternal Father; through your Son, Jesus Christ, our risen Lord. **C: Amen.**

Peace

Because of Jesus' death and resurrection. God does not hold our sins against us. This is true peace, Like Jesus with his disciples, pastor shares the word of reconciliation from God to us


