

#### Prayer of the Day

#### The Liturgy of the Word

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

God engages us in holy conversation – speaking and listening.

Let us open our ears and hearts to hear God's voice in the words spoken to us.

Let us celebrate new life by putting God's Word into action.

#### First Reading — Acts 7:55-60

A reading from Acts

<sup>55</sup>Filled with the Holy Spirit, [Stephen] gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. <sup>56</sup>"Look," he said, "I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!" <sup>57</sup>But they covered their ears, and with a loud shout all rushed together against him. <sup>56</sup>Then they dragged him out of the city and began to stone him; and the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. <sup>56</sup>While they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." <sup>60</sup>Then he knelt down and cried out in a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." When he had said this, he died.

P: The Word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God.** 

#### Psalm 31:1-5, 15-16

'In you, O LORD, have I taken refuge; let me never be 'put to shame; deliver me 'in your righteousness.

#### <sup>2</sup>Incline your 'ear to me; make haste to de- 'liver me.

Be my strong rock, a castle to keep me safe, for you are my crag and my stronghold; for the sake of your name, lead me and guide me.

\*Take me out of the net that they have secretly set for me, for you are my tow-'er of strength.

Into your hands I com- mend my spirit, for you have redeemed me, O LORD, O God of truth.

<sup>15</sup>My times are 'in your hand; rescue me from the hand of my enemies, and from those who 'persecute me.

<sup>16</sup>Make your face to shine up-1 on your servant, and in your loving-1 kindness save me.

#### A reading from 1 Peter

Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation—"if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. <sup>4</sup>Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and blike living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture: "See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame." <sup>7</sup>To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner," and "A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall." They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

P: The word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God.**

#### Holy Gospel — John 14:1-14

P: The holy gospel according to St. John. **C: Glory to you, O Lord.** 


[Jesus said to the disciples:] ""Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. And you

know the way to the place where I am going." Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" "Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him." Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied." "Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? "Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. \*Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. <sup>12</sup>Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. 13I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. 14lf in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it."

P: The gospel of the Lord. **C: Praise to you, O Christ**.

#### The Message

The assembly is seated. Silence for reflection follows the sermon.



#### Nicene Creed

Together with the whole Church, we confess our faith:

C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father.

Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven;

by the power of the Holy Spirit

he became incarnate from the virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.

He has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen

P: Show your steadfast love through all creation. Protect the earth's diverse habitats from the forces of pollution, erosion, extinction, and global warming. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.** 

P: By your Spirit, guide us into all truth. Give wisdom to world and local leaders and organizations as they begin, build, or renew relationships. Strengthen leaders and aid organizations in areas needing to be rebuilt following conflict, unrest, or natural disaster. Hear us, O God.

#### C: Your mercy is great.

P: Abide with refugees, those experiencing homelessness, those fleeing war and poverty, and all who question if there is a home in your heart. Be a healing presence for all who are sick, *especially......* Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.** 

P: Accompany your people amid uncertainty and change. Uphold people in this community who have recently moved, changed jobs or schools, retired, or are going through transitions of any kind. Lead us in your ways. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.** 

P: Gather us with all the saints at your heavenly banquet. Accept our thanks for those who have gone before us and who show us your love. Grant confidence and comfort for all awaiting the place you have prepared as we wait for the glorious coming of our Savior at the last day. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.** 

P: Rejoicing in the victory of Christ's resurrection, we lift our prayers and praise to you, almighty and eternal Father; through your Son, Jesus Christ, our risen Lord. **C: Amen.** 

#### Peace

Because of Jesus' death and resurrection. God does not hold our sins against us. This is true peace, Like Jesus with his disciples, pastor shares the word of reconciliation from God to us.
