

#### **Confession & Forgiveness**

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

P: Lord Jesus, you show us the Father's love and grace. Lord, have mercy. **C: We confess our failure to love others as you love us.** Lord, have mercy.

P: Lord Jesus, you defeated death and give life to all who keep your word. Christ, have mercy. **C: We confess that we ignore your word and miss out on abundant life. Christ, have mercy.** 

P: Lord Jesus, you pour out your Holy Spirit upon us, with gifts for the good of all. Lord, have mercy. **C: Forgive us when we do not use our gifts and forget the needs of others. Lord, have mercy.** 

P: God, who is rich in mercy, loved us even when we were dead in sin, and made us alive together with Christ. By grace you have been saved. In the name of + Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven. Almighty God strengthen you with power through the Holy Spirit, that Christ may live in your hearts through faith. **C: Amen**

#### The Liturgy of the Word

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

#### First Reading – Isaiah 55:1-5

#### A reading from Isaiah

<sup>1</sup>Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price. <sup>a</sup>Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy? Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food. <sup>a</sup>Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live. I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, sure love for David. <sup>a</sup>See, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples. <sup>a</sup>See, you shall call nations that you do not know, and nations that do not know you shall run to you, because of the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, for he has glorified you.

P: The Word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

#### Psalm 145:8-9, 15-22

"The LORD is gracious and full ' of compassion, slow to anger and ' of great kindness.

"The LORD is loving to 'everyone and his compassion is over 'all his works.

#### Second Reading – Romans 9:1-5

#### A reading from Romans

<sup>1</sup>I am speaking the truth in Christ—I am not lying; my conscience confirms it by the Holy Spirit—<sup>2</sup>I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. <sup>3</sup>For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my own people, my kindred according to the flesh. <sup>4</sup>They are Israelites, and to them belong the adoption, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises; <sup>5</sup>to them belong the patriarchs, and from them, according to the flesh, comes the Messiah, who is over all, God blessed forever. Amen.

P: The word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God.** 

#### Gospel Acclamation #611a

The assembly stands to welcome the gospel. The cantor will sing the alleluia once alone and then the congregation repeats it.



*Alleluia.* One does not live by 'bread alone,\* but by every word that comes from the 'mouth of God. *Alleluia.* [Matt. 4:4]

#### Holy Gospel – Matthew 14:13-21

P: The holy gospel according to St. Matthew. C: Glory to you, O Lord.

<sup>13</sup>Now when Jesus heard [about the beheading of John the Baptist], he withdrew from there in a boat to a deserted place by himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns. <sup>14</sup>When he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick. <sup>15</sup>When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves." <sup>16</sup>Jesus said to them, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." <sup>17</sup>They replied, "We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish." <sup>19</sup>And he said, "Bring them here to me." <sup>19</sup>Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. <sup>20</sup>And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. <sup>21</sup>And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

P: The gospel of the Lord. C: Praise to you, O Christ.

#### **Apostles' Creed**

God has made us his people through our Baptism into Christ. Living together in trust and hope, we confess our faith.

C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended into hell.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

#### Prayers of the Church

P: Holy God, gather your church together by the Holy Spirit. Inspire all the baptized to proclaim your abundant love throughout the world. Guide us in the mission of the gospel through word and deed. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.** 

P: As You cherish your creation, from the smallest microbe to the largest mountain, so raise us up to care for all you have created. Protect fragile ecosystems, send favorable weather, and supply food and water to nourish all creatures. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.** 

P: Instill within all political leaders your desire for peace and justice in all the world. Support the work of international peace organizations, and provide relief for those in war-torn areas. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.** 

P: Comfort those who are hurting, accompany those who are alone, heal those who are sick, provide for all who hunger or thirst, console the bereaved, bring joy to the sorrowful, and attend to all who call on you. We pray especially for those we name now...... Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great**.

P: Reveal yourself to us in worship, fellowship, and ministry with our neighbors. Provide for feeding ministries and food banks in our area, that we share your abundance with all who hunger. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great**.

P: Accept our thanks for all the saints whose lives are examples of faithful living and who have witnessed to your promises throughout time and space. Rouse us by their lives of service and dedication to be your hands and feet in this world as we wait for the day of Christ's glorious coming. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.** 

P: Into your hands, Father, we commend all for whom we pray, in the name of the one who reconciled all creation to himself, your Son, Jesus Christ our Savior. **C: Amen.** 

#### Peace

Because of Jesus' death and resurrection. God does not hold our sins against us. This is true peace, Like Jesus with his disciples, pastor shares the word of reconciliation from God to us.

Lord, remember us in your kingdom and teach us how to pray.


C: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.


