All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

P: Lord Jesus, you look on us with compassion and seek us when we are lost. Lord, have mercy.

C: Forgive our straying from your path and help us to forgive others. Lord, have mercy.

P: Lord Jesus, you have mercy on all who need healing and comfort. Christ, have mercy.

C: Forgive us when we forget to turn to you in our troubles. Christ, have mercy.

P: Lord Jesus, you plead for sinners at the throne of judgment. Lord, have mercy.


C: Forgive us when we try to defend ourselves instead of trusting you. Lord, have mercy.

The presiding minister announces God's forgiveness with these or similar words.

P: In the mercy of almighty God, Jesus Christ was given to die for us, and for his sake God forgives us all our sins. As a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ, and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **C: Amen.**

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. **C: And also with you.**

The Liturgy of the Word

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

First Reading – Ezekiel 33:7-11

A reading from Ezekiel

²So you, mortal, I have made a sentinel for the house of Israel; whenever you hear a word from my mouth, you shall give them warning from me. ⁸If I say to the wicked, "O wicked ones, you shall surely die," and you do not speak to warn the wicked to turn from their ways, the wicked shall die in their iniquity, but their blood I will require at your hand. ⁸But if you warn the wicked to turn from their ways, and they do not turn from their ways, the wicked shall die in their iniquity, but you will have saved your life. ¹⁰Now you, mortal, say to the house of Israel, Thus you have said: "Our transgressions and our sins weigh upon us, and we waste away because of them; how then can we live?" ¹¹Say to them, As I live, says the Lord GOD, I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from their ways and live; turn back, turn back from your evil ways; for why will you die, O house of Israel?

P: The Word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

Psalm 119:33-40

³³Teach me, O LORD, the way' of your statutes, and I shall keep it' to the end.

³⁴Give me understanding, and I shall 'keep your teaching; I shall keep it with 'all my heart.

³⁵Lead me in the path of 'your commandments, for that is 'my desire.

³⁸Incline my heart to ' your decrees and not to ' unjust gain.

³⁷Turn my eyes from be-' holding falsehood; give me life ' in your way.

³⁸Fulfill your promise ' to your servant, which is for ' those who fear you.

³⁹Turn away the reproach ' that I dread, because your judg- ' ments are good.

⁴⁰Behold, I long for ' your commandments; by your righteousness en-' liven me.

Second Reading – Romans 13:8-14

A reading from Romans

⁶Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. ⁸The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet"; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbor as yourself." ¹⁰Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law. ¹¹Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; ¹²the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; ¹³let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in guarreling and jealousy. ¹⁴Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

P: The word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

The assembly stands to welcome the gospel.

The cantor will sing the alleluia once alone and then the congregation repeats it.



Verses may be sung by a leader. Then the alleluia is repeated.

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Alleluia. In Christ God was reconciling the world 'to himself,* entrusting the message of reconcilia-1 tion to us. Alleluia. (2 Cor. 5:19)

Holy Gospel – Matthew 18:15-20

P: The holy gospel according to St. Matthew. C: Glory to you, O Lord.

[Jesus said to the disciples:] ¹⁵"If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. ¹⁶But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. ¹⁷If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. ¹⁸Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. ¹⁹Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be


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done for you by my Father in heaven. ²⁰For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."

Apostles' Creed

 - and born of the virgin Mary.
 - He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
 - was crucified, died, and was buried.
 - He descended into hell.
 - On the third day he rose again.
 - He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

P: Reveal your miracles to us and move us to cherish you as we behold the wonders of creation. Renew the seas and the soil, the forests and the creatures that live in them. Turn us to ways of living that contribute to Earth's thriving. Merciful God, C: receive our prayer.

P: Inspire us to lead with honor and guide judges and legislators, police, and government officials to create and uphold just laws. Move us to treat all people with dignity and guide our conversations with one another. Merciful God, C: receive our prayer.

P: Help us comfort those who suffer and reassure any who are harmed by the wicked acts of others. Bring peace to all who are vulnerable, frightened, despairing, or sick, especially those we name now.... (brief pause). Guard their waking and their sleeping. Merciful God,

C: receive our prayer.

P: Challenge and encourage your people to value the vocation to which each is called. By your Holy Spirit, guide all who are discerning new possibilities or changing employment or schools. In all our diverse callings, teach us to love our neighbors above all else. Merciful God,

C: receive our prayer.

P: Be our hope, O God, and accept our thanks for your saints who died in faith. May their trust in your promise be our protection and our hope. Merciful God, C: receive our prayer.

P: Heavenly Father, remember us according to your steadfast love as we offer these and the prayers of our heart, trusting in your compassion made known through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. C: Amen.

Peace

Because of Jesus' death and resurrection. God does not hold our sins against us. This is true peace, Like Jesus with his disciples, pastor shares the word of reconciliation from God to us.
