

Apostolic Greeting



Kyrie


The cantor begins and the congregation repeats.

Prayer of the Day

The Liturgy of the Word

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song. God engages us in holy conversation – speaking and listening. Let us open our ears and hearts to hear God's voice in the words spoken to us. Let us celebrate new life by putting God's Word into action.

First Reading – Acts 2:1-21

A reading from Acts

When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ^aDivided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. "Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. ⁷Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? "And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, "Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." ¹²All were amazed and perplexed, saving to one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." ¹⁴But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. ¹⁵Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. ¹⁶No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: ¹⁷'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. ¹⁸Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy.¹⁹And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. ²⁰The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day.²¹Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'"

P: The Word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

Psalm 104:25-35, 37

²⁵O LORD, how manifold ¹ are your works!

In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full ' of your creatures.

³⁵May these words ' of mine please him; I will rejoice ' in the LORD.

³⁷Bless the LORD, ¹O my soul. Hal-¹ lelujah!

Second Reading – 1 Corinthians 12:3b-13

A reading from First Corinthians


[®]No one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. ⁴Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; ⁶and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. ⁷To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. "To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, "to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, ¹⁰to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. "All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses. ¹²For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body-Jews or Greeks, slaves or free-and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

P: The word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God.**


Holy Gospel — *John 20:19-23* P: The holy gospel according to St. John. C: Glory to you, O Lord.



Nicene Creed

Together with the whole Church, we confess our faith:

C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen

A brief silence.

P: Holy God, send your Holy Spirit to impassion and equip us to bring the good news of Jesus risen from the dead to all those who long for you. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.**

P: Send your Spirit of understanding to immigrants, refugees, and any experiencing language barriers. Bless the work of translators, teachers of English to those learning a second language, ambassadors, and international peace organizations. Safely guide those fleeing war and danger. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.**

P: Make us aware of the variety of gifts your Holy Spirit grants. Ignite in us the desire to learn from one another, especially those who differ from us. Make your presence known through missionaries, peace workers, and through the outreach ministries of our synod and community, especially as our synod gathers in assembly in this coming week. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.**

P: Accept our thanks for those who have died in the hope of new life in you. As we observe Memorial Day, we remember those who died in military service. Comfort all who mourn, as with all the saints, we await the day when Christ will come to complete your work in a world where war is no more. Hear us, O God. **C: Your mercy is great.**

P: Rejoicing in the victory of Christ's resurrection, we lift our prayers and praise to you, almighty and eternal Father; through your Son, Jesus Christ, our risen Lord. **C: Amen.**

Peace

Because of Jesus' death and resurrection. God does not hold our sins against us. This is

true peace, Like Jesus with his disciples, pastor shares the word of reconciliation from God to us.

P: The peace of the Lord be with you always. **C: And also with you.**

We share Christ's forgiving and reconciling love with one another, binding ourselves to one another as community. As we are at peace with God, so we are also at peace with one another.

forever and ever. Amen.


